
- How many syllables are there in *caramel*?

with 2 syllables ("car-ml") (38.02%)




with 3 syllables ("carra-mel") (37.66%)

other (0.34%)



all 3 are the same (56.88%)




all 3 are different (17.34%)

other (2.40%)






